A year ago she set up the "Don't Fret Pet" service. Pet owners who are going away can arrange for their dog or cat to be cared for in the home of another pet lover.


Jenny checks the home and the carer to make sure the pet will be safe and happy. On her register of interested carers are people who will look after almost any type of dog.
